About Abbotsford and the Region

The host city, Abbotsford, is located about 80 km (50 miles) East of Vancouver in the Canadian Province of British Columbia, and about 200 km (120 miles) North of Seattle, WA. A city of about 150000, it is fair to say that Abbotsford is where Metro Vancouver (with a population of about 2 million people) ends and the scenic Fraser River Valley begins.

Beyond the event itself, your visit to Abbotsford provides endless possibilities to enjoy this wonderful part of Canada's Pacific Coast. Abbotsford is:

- About 3.5 hours drive from Whistler, BC and its famous bike park
- About 6 hours by car and ferry to Victoria, BC, host city of the 2007 BMX World Championships
- About 7 hours by car and ferry to the surfing mecca of Tofino and Pacific Rim National Park
- About 11 hours from Banff and Jasper, Canada's Rocky Mountain National Parks

Or, simply enjoy the region itself. Abbotsford, the Fraser Valley and Metro Vancouver have much to offer, including:

- One of North America's fastest growing wine regions
- The beautiful and multicultural City of Vancouver, the host of the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games
- · Great seafood and sushi
- Coastal whale watching cruises
- Attractions such as Hell's Gate and Harrison Hot Springs
- Many opportunities for outdoor recreation such as hiking, climbing, camping and mountain biking

Traveling To The Event

Traveling To Abbotsford

There are several options available when traveling to Abbotsford.

Abbotsford Airport

If you arrive in Canada through either Calgary or Edmonton, Westjet, Canada's second largest airline, offers several daily flights direct to Abbotsford from both of these cities. Abbotsford Airport is about a 10-minute drive from the venue and from the official hotel.


If you are arriving from within North America, you may wish to consider this option. This may also be an option for those arriving from Europe or Asia who do not mind an extra flight transfer in Calgary or Edmonton; most travel agents can book flights with Westjet. Note: Presently, there is significant highway construction underway between Vancouver and Abbotsford, which can significantly slow the drive depending upon the time of day.

Vancouver International Airport

Vancouver International Airport, Canada's second largest airport, is approximately 80 km West of Abbotsford. The drive takes about 60 to 120 minutes depending on traffic and the time of day. Most major North American, Asian and European carriers offer daily service to and from Vancouver.

Seattle - Tacoma International Airport

Finally, Seattle – Tacoma International Airport is approximately 220 km south of Abbotsford. The drive from Seattle takes about 2.5 to 4 hours, depending on traffic in the Seattle area, and on traffic at the land border crossing between Canada and the United States at Sumas, WA.



Directions To The Track

The track is located at Abbotsford Exhibition Park, at 32470 Haida Drive, Abbotsford. Maps and driving directions to the track from the Official Hotel and the three closest airports are found in the Appendix of this document.

Tip: If driving across the border from the United States, the border crossing at Sumas, WA is only a few kilometres south of the track. Also, this border crossing is usually much less busy that the main regional border crossing at Peace Arch (Blaine, WA).

The Official Hotel

The official hotel of the event is the Sandman Hotel & Suites, located less than a 5-minute (~ 2 km) drive from the track at 32720 Simon Avenue in Abbotsford. It is also located close to all major services including restaurants and grocery stores. This recently built hotel offers 1-bedroom suites with full kitchens; bikes are permitted in the rooms. The capacity of the rooms can be expanded with good quality mattresses available from the front desk.

Should the official hotel sell out, backup locations are located in Langley, BC approximately a 20 minute drive away from the venue farther West along Highway 1, located at the exit for 200 Street; both over flow hotels are next to the highway, on opposite sides of it.

Visas

Unfortunately, participants from some countries will need to obtain a visa in order to enter Canada. Should this be the case, we will be pleased to provide you with a letter of invitation to the event in support of your visa application.

- The full name, nationality, country of residence, date of birth and postal address of each person who needs a letter of invitation.
- Whether the person requesting the letter is team staff or a rider participating in the event.

Please ensure that you request your letter and apply for your visa well in advance.

The Venue

The venue for the event is Abbotsford Exhibition Park, a 75-acre urban multi-sport park in North – Central Abbotsford. Some may remember the venue as the location of the Pre-Worlds Competition for the 2007 BMX World Championship. The entrance to the park is found at 32470 Haida Drive in Abbotsford.

Home to the first permanent Supercross start hill in Canada and the Abbotsford BMX Club, the track has been rebuilt to be both demanding and exciting.

The park has ample parking and is close to hotels, restaurants and other services, as well as to the Abbotsford Regional Hospital.

Team Parking

Teams will be given a special parking pass during registration, which will grant access to the Team Parking lot, which is close to the team entrance. The team lot will be available for use beginning on September 13, 2012.

Team Tents

As a relatively new concept for Supercross events, we plan to offer two sections for team tents. The first section of team tents will be located behind and next to the second corner, at track-side and will also be very close to the start-hill and staging. A limited number of these tents will be available on a first-come, first-served basis at a cost of $500 / 3m \times 3m$ tent $(10' \times 10')$. There will be a small space separating each tent, acknowledging that some overflow is inevitable.

The second section of team tents will be located on the other side of the start hill at track-level, without a direct view of the track. These will be rented at a cost of \$300 $/ 3m \times 3m$ tent (10' x 10').

Should a team wish to book a second or third tent, the price of the additional tents will be reduced by 25%. Also, each tent will include several cases of water and 4 chairs. Please note that neither teams nor individuals are permitted to set up their own tents anywhere within the team area or within the perimeter fence surrounding the venue.

The deadline to book a team tent is August 15, 2012; team tents must be fully paid for at event registration on September 13 in Canadian Dollars with a major credit card (Visa or Mastercard) or cash. If this is not possible, a bank wire transfer may be arranged, if discussed with us in advance. Should you wish to pay in advance, you may do so with Visa or Mastercard by providing the card details on the booking form.

Teams interested in booking one or more tents may do so by completing the booking form in Appendix 6 and by sending it to the participant liaison, Tara Mowat tara@cyclingbc.net / Fax +1 604 737 3141. Tents are non-refundable and must be paid for before the riders on the team concerned will be given their number plates. Please bring your completed booking form found in Appendix 6 with you to registration, along with payment.

Rider Lounge

The second team tent area will feature a food service tent for team staff and riders; light meals and non-alcoholic drinks will be available free of charge. This will be available during practice and competition.

Expo Area

The venue will feature an exhibition zone for event sponsors, teams, exhibitors and other businesses. The expo area is open to spectators with tickets, event participants and the general public, and presents a great opportunity to showcase your brand and products or services.

All expo area lots are un-serviced, and are available for \$400 for the entire event for a $3m \times 3m$ space (10' $\times 10$ ').

This includes but is not limited to riders, team staff and media persons.

Conflicting Information

In the event that any information found in this competition guide conflicts with that found on the event web site or with that found in any other publication concerning this event, the information found in the most recent version of this competition guide shall be taken as correct.

Should any information concerning this event, whether in the competition guide or elsewhere conflict with the UCI Regulations, then the UCI regulations shall prevail.

Should weather conditions or some other unforeseen event require once the event has begun, the UCI, the Technical Delegate, the Commissaires and Race Organization may at any time decide together to cancel the event (while considering any articles of the UCI Regulations that may apply). Should such changes be made, the manager of each team will be notified in writing via a communiqué as soon as possible. No individual or team is entitled to any form of compensation should this occur.

Similarly, should the event be cancelled at some point before the schedule begins, National Federations and teams shall be notified through the UCI. Again, no individual or team is entitled to any form of compensation should this occur.

Practical Information

Emergency Information

While Abbotsford and indeed all of BC are considered to be safe places, emergencies do sometimes happen. Emergency services such as police, fire department and ambulance can all be reached by dialing '911'. This is a free call on any mobile, landline or or pay phone. To reach any of these services on a non-emergency basis, look in a phone directory or simply dial "411" for directory assistance.

Directions to the Nearest Hospital

A map with directions is in the "Maps and Directions" Appendix of this document.

Power

As with the United States, power in Canada is 120 Volts delivered at a frequency of 60 hertz. Most outlets accept two or three pronged plugs according to the North American standard.

Telephone

The telephone country code for both Canada and the United States is "1"; the local area codes for Abbotsford and Metro Vancouver are 604 and 778.

Regardless of whether you are dialing a mobile phone or a landline, all 10 digits of each phone number including the area code are dialed. For example, 604 737 3034.

To make a call within North America, but beyond the local area (generally the city where you are located), first dial "1" followed by the rest of the telephone number. To make an international call outside of North America, first dial the international access code "011" followed by the 2-digit country code of the country that you are calling, followed by the rest of the telephone number.

Climate / Weather

The middle of September in Abbotsford is generally dry and warm, with average daily high temperatures of 21 Celcius (70 Farenheit). Sunrise is at 06h45 and Sunset is at 19h25.

Time Zone

In September, Abbotsford is within the Pacific Daylight Time Zone (GMT/UTC - 7).

Currency

The local currency is the Canadian Dollar. As of July 2012, 1 Canadian Dollar ~ 1 US Dollar, or approximately 0.92 CHF, 0.77 Euro or 0.63 GBP.

Media Access and Accreditation

All media persons planning to attend the event must be accredited in order to gain access to the venue. The application deadline for Media Accreditation is September 1, 2012. 

Access To Team Parking

Team parking is accessed via Haida Drive; to reach the team parking lot, turn left once you have entered the venue, following the signs. The parking lot is to your right at Point "N" on the venue map.

Important Note: The Parking Pass received at registration is required to be granted access to the Team Parking Lot (Thursday to Saturday).

Location of Doping Control Station

The Doping Control Station (point "R" on the venue map) is behind the main buildings that you passed when entering the venue. Riders / manager can follow the signs from the team area.

Location of Team Tents and Rider Lounge

The Team Tents (for those teams that booked tents in advance) are found at point "B" on the venue map, inside a security zone. Either rider or team staff accreditation is required to access this area (Thursday to Sunday). This is approximately 100m east of the Team Parking lot, and is located just south of the track next on the far side of the start hill.

Important Note: Teams are not permitted to use their own tents; only the tents provided by the organization may be used. However, the rider lounge is available for the use of all riders.

Location of the Medical Room


The medical room (point "P" on the venue map) is located just behind the 1st corner. It is within the same security zone as the Team Tent / Rider Lounge area.

Location of Race Administration Offices

Team Managers with queries for the race administration, UCI / GSX or the Commissaires can find these offices within the Security Zone located just north of the track in the corner of the parking lot just behind the spectator area (point "P" on the venue map).


Appendix 2 – Driving Directions and Maps

From the Official Hotel



From the Sandman Hotel, turn left from Simon Drive (the road on which the hotel is located) on to Gladwin Road. Travel north on Gladwin Road for about 1.5 km (just under 1 mile) and turn left on Haida Drive. The entrance to Exhibition Park and the parking lot is on the left approximately 600m from the intersection with Gladwin Road.

From Vancouver International Airport




If you are traveling from the Vancouver International Airport, upon exiting the airport parking lot, follow Sea Island Way east, following the signs for BC Route 99 South (Direction Richmond Centre / Seattle). Merge on to BC Route 99 South, and follow it for about 2 km (1 ¼ miles) until you reach BC Route 91 East (exit 37). Take exit 37 East, and follow BC Route 91 East for about 15 km (9 miles), across the Alex Fraser Bridge. Take the first exit immediately after crossing the bridge (Nordel Way) and follow Nordel Way north and then east through the City of Surrey.

After about 6 km (3 ½ miles), Nordel Way becomes 88 Avenue. Follow 88 Avenue east for a further 3 km (1 ¾ miles) until you reach King George Boulevard. Turn left (north) on King George Boulevard. Follow King George Boulevard north for 1.5 km (1 mile) until you reach 96 Avenue. Turn right (east) on 96 Avenue and follow it for 8 km (5 miles) until you reach the intersection with Highway 1; take Highway 1 east towards Abbotsford / Chilliwack / Hope.


When you reach Abbotsford after about 40 km (25 miles) on the highway, take exit 83 East (Mt. Lehman Road / Fraser Highway) and follow Fraser Highway East across Highway 1. After a short time Fraser Highway becomes McClure Road. Follow McClure Road east until you reach Trethewey Street. Turn left (North) on Trethewey Street. Trethewey Street sweeps to the east and becomes Haida Drive. Just after the wide sweeping corner, turn right into Exhibition Park.

From the Abbotsford Airport



From the airport parking lot, turn right (North) on Mt. Lehman Road and follow it north for about 1 km until you reach Simpson Road. Turn right on Simpson road, which will shortly become Peardonville Road. Follow Peardonville Road east, across the highway. Once across the highway, Peardonville Road splits into South Fraser Way (slight left) while Peardonville Road continues. Follow South Fraser Way to the left until you reach Gladwin Road. Turn left on to Gladwin Road and drive north on Gladwin Road for about 1 km until you reach Haida Drive. Turn left on Haida drive; the entrance to Exhibition Park and the parking lot is on the left approximately 600m from the intersection with Gladwin Road.


From Seattle - Tacoma International Airport



Follow the signs from the Airport to Interstate Highway 5, North. Follow Interstate Highway 5 north for about 105 miles (170 km) until you reach Bellingham, WA. On the north side of Bellingham, take exit 255 east on to Route 542 (East Sunset Drive / Mt. Baker Highway). Follow Route 542 east until you reach the intersection with State Highway 9 (about 23 miles / 37 km). Turn left (north) on to State Highway 9; drive north on State Highway 9 until you reach the Canada / United States border crossing at Sumas, WA.

Once you have passed through the Canadian Border Checkpoint, continue north on Sumas Way, for just under 3 miles (5 km) until you reach the intersection with South Fraser Way. Turn left on South Fraser Way and follow it until you reach Gladwin Road. Turn right (north) on Gladwin Road and drive north on Gladwin Road for about 1 km until you reach Haida Drive. Turn left on Haida drive; the entrance to Exhibition Park and the parking lot is on the left approximately 600m from the intersection with Gladwin Road.

Appendix 3 – Directions to Nearest Hospital



The closest hospital and emergency room to the venue is the Abbotsford Regional Hospital and Cancer Centre, located just over 4 km (2.5 miles) away at 32900 Marshall Road in Abbotsford.

To reach it, leave the venue and turn right on Haida Drive. When you reach the intersection with Gladwin Road, turn right. Follow Gladwin Road south until you reach Mill Lake Park; at this point, Gladwin Road sweeps to the right and becomes Peardonville Road. Just after this turn, make a left turn (south) on to Emerson Street and continue south until you reach Marshall Road. Turn left (east) on Marshall road and continue a short distance east until you reach the Hospital.
